It is a legal requirement to notify us if you have any cow that aborts or have any animal that suddenly dies. DEFRA will usually ask us to visit and take samples from the animal at *their expense*. It may be a hassle but it does give you a free visit on farm and obviously we can also look at other sick animals or do routine work at the same time. So remember to call us...

BVD Eradication Scheme Update

Since the last newsletter we have received more results and the farmers who have passed the first test be it milk antibody for the dairies or blood samples for the beef herds are listed below.

Please remember, you are not accredited free, until a second free test. It is very important that you do not "buy in" or hire any animals without testing them first or sourcing them from other free herds.

Individual farms are liable for the membership fees, billed to you direct, however for dairies on the dairy scheme we will credit your account with the cost of the bulk milk antibody testing.

Diseases around lambing.

Ewes pre-lambing:

- Pregnancy toxemia (twin lamb) - energy deficiency in late pregnancy when the lambs are growing rapidly. Signs vary with severity from hanging back to recumbency and death. Treatment with and twin lamb drench +/- CMD. NB - prevention is better than cure - nutrition.
- Hypocalcaemia - lack of calcium in late pregnancy. Signs similar to twin lamb. Treat with CMD under the skin.
- Prolapsed vagina - Last month pre-lamb. Vagina protrudes from lips of vulva. Clean, replace with lubricant and secure with prolapse retainer.
- Abortion - many and varied causes. Please get in touch if you're having a problem so we can investigate.

Ewes at lambing:

- Dystocia - difficult lambings. Know when to intervene and when to call for help!
- Metritis - Inflammation of the uterus due to infection. Veterinary treatment is best, prevention is better.
- Retained placenta - Numerous causes. Can lead to metritis. Gentle traction and antibiotics.
- Prolapsed uterus - Call the vet and protect from damage until they arrive.
- Mastitis - infection of the udder - treatment is necessary to help save the udder.

New-born lambs:

- Watery mouth - Caused by E.Coli, ensure adequate colostrum in first few hours of life. Prophylactic antibiotics can be given at birth in 'problem' flocks.
- Navel ill and joint ill - navel dipping with 10% iodine is effective prevention. Treatment is with a long course of antibiotics.
- Scours - Clean out the lambing pens regularly to prevent build up of bacteria. Take samples to find the cause.
- Hypothermia - Chilling of lambs. Ensure adequate colostrum after birth and always feed hypothermic lambs before warming them.
- Entropion - a turning in of the eyelid. This condition is hereditary so be aware of breeding policies. We can supply you with Michel clips to correct it.
